Title: More Faith

Mark 4:40 - He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

Simple Faith:

Mark 4:35 - That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side."

Hebrews 11:1 - Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

Increasing Faith:

Mark 4:40 - He said to his disciples... Do you still have no faith?"

Luke 17:5 - The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!"

Remembering Faith:

Mark 4:38b-39 - The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" 39 He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

1 Peter 5:7 (NKJV) - Casting all your cares on him because he cares for you.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Mark 4:35-41; Psalm 107:23-31

1. In the midst of the crazy stormy conditions we are living in, if Jesus asked you "What condition is your faith in?" what would you say?
2. Think back on some past stormy situations you have faced. How did your faith help you get through those difficult times?
3. Simple faith trusts God's Word. When is trusting God's Word easy for you? When is your faith in God's Word challenged?
4. Has your faith increased over time? Have you ever asked God to "increase your faith?"
5. How have you seen increasing faith calm someone's fears? Can you name a time when this took place in your own life?
6. Why, even after walking with the Lord for many years, might a person in the midst of a storm fail to remember something as basic as "God is with me" and immediately turn to the Lord for help in their time of need?
7. How important to you is casting your cares on the Lord? Is this an ongoing practice in your life?
8. How can simple faith, increasing faith, and remembering faith calm your fears today in whatever stormy situation you find yourself?
