### Questions for Reflection and Discussion

John 14:1-6

1. Does the thought of heaven and what waits for you there help you to have hope when you're feeling troubled?
2. What other types of things (besides heaven) do people often look to or try to hold onto when they're feeling troubled? Do these things ultimately help? Why or why not?
3. Why does Jesus tell his disciples not to let their hearts be troubled? What has Jesus been telling them up until this point that might give them reason to be troubled?
4. What point might Jesus be trying to make when he tells the disciples, "You believe in God; believe also in me" (v. 1)?
5. What specific things can we learn about what heaven will be like from this passage?
6. Jesus' statement of exclusivity in verse 6 is one of the most difficult claims of Jesus for people to accept, particularly for those who think there are multiple ways to get to heaven. Is Jesus just being narrow-minded? Why or why not?
7. Does this passage only provide hope for the future, or does it have any application in the present?
